Some of you may recall that as recently as December of 2007, just before the opening of Clark, we housed over 1200 students. We are excited about working with your students and you to make this a productive year for all of us.

We have changed a few major pieces for communication with you in the past few months.

- You may have already noticed that the website, most easily accessible by going to www.lcsc.us and clicking on the link to Grimmer, is user friendly. Our webmaster will try to keep it updated and you will be seeing more links at that site in the next few weeks.
- Secondly, we are no longer using Edline, but instead are going to be using a parent access that links directly to our teachers' gradebooks. You will be getting "real time" information regarding the grades your student has earned. Eventually, you will be able to see attendance for your student on that site and next year we hope to use it to allow you to complete the registration process on-line.
- Alert Now will continue to be used to remind you of major upcoming school events in addition to being used as an emergency contact if school is cancelled or delayed. When you receive the message, if you need it repeated or can't understand what is being said, press one and it will start over. Generally this helps to make it clearer and gives you a chance to make note of the specific times and dates being mentioned.

Our theme this year is "Go Beyond". We will be challenging each student to stretch themselves academically, socially and physically as the staff also strives to try some new technology and to connect the academics in some new ways. Welcome to the Grimmer family. I look forward to it being another exciting and rewarding year for all of us.

Mrs. Rebey had been working with L.C. students at Watson Elementary School as their Home/School Advisor. She is familiar with students and staff and is excited about continuing to work with everyone here at Grimmer.

Ms. DiPaolo will continue to be guidance counselor for students with the last names beginning M-Z. We feel it is important to have a synergistic working relationship with parents, students, and staff for the overall success of our students. Please feel free to use us as a resource to assist your family in the educational process. In addition, to the guidance counselors in the department Mrs. Claesgens, Home/School Advisor, is the liaison for Westlake students. An additional resource is Mrs. Pollalis, guidance secretary, and she is here to assist you as well.

We encourage parents to keep the lines of communications open with teachers via email or telephone. Also, students have received an agenda book to keep track of homework assignments and other important information. Homework is a percentage of the grade and also reinforces what has been learned in class. Therefore, we also encourage parents to check agenda books each night to make sure that homework assignments are being completed.

Any student in the 6th-8th grade who is interested in being a Student Ambassador should sign up in the guidance office. The Student Ambassadors program is designed to assist new move-in students with the skills and resources needed to adjust to their new school environment. Student Ambassadors must be dependable and reliable students who are great role models for their peers.

PARENT ACCESS TO REGIONAL DATA SERVICES (RDS)

In an effort to improve the quality and timeliness in the delivery of information to both parents and students, the Lake Central School Corporation has converted from Edline to an improved product from RDS.

RDS, Parent Access will enable parents and students to quickly retrieve information regarding grades, attendance, discipline, and homework via a web-based system. By Sept. 7, 2009 all parents/guardians will receive a 16 digit authorization code through the US mail. This code will be sent only to the legal guardian of each student. It is important that you file this code in a safe place, as it will require anyone who misplaces the code to report to school, in person, in order to receive a duplicate copy. A separate instructional letter on the details for use of this system will accompany the authorization code.

NATIONAL JUNIOR HONOR SOCIETY

The Michael Grimmer Middle School (GMS) Chapter of National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) is designed to provide services to GMS and the community. NJHS members take part in various services, such as volunteer work at school functions and other services to the community.

Admission to NJHS is by invitation for those 7th and 8th grade students who have a 3.33 or higher Grade Point Average (GPA). The candidates must also demonstrate that they value the qualities espoused by the NJHS which are scholarship, leadership, character, service, and citizenship.

ACADEMIC SUPERBOWL

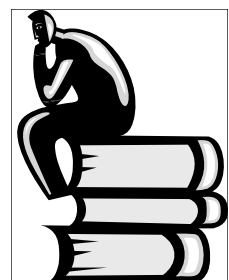

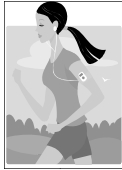
~Fifth~Grade~Cooking~Club~

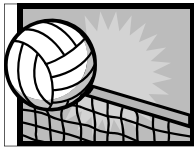

~PARKING AND TRAFFIC~SLOW DOWN~WE HAVE A NEW SPEED BUMP~

Please read and abide by these rules when entering our Grimmer driveways and parking lots.

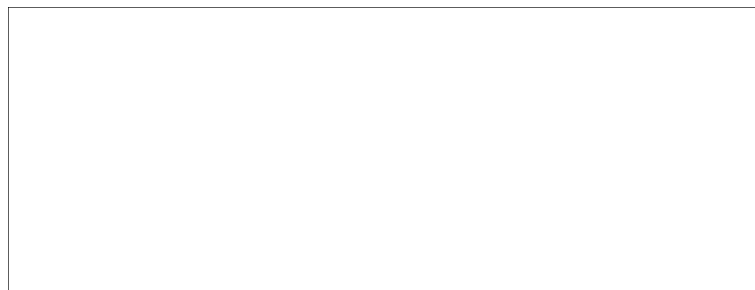
1. Abide by the speed limit. Ten m.p.h. is the absolute fastest anyone should ever be moving in our drives. There is too much pedestrian traffic to have it be any faster. Please slow down!
2. If you plan to come inside and get your child, or escort them into the building, please park in the lot. The drive out front is actually a fire lane and cars should not park there without the driver being in the car.
3. If you are dropping your child off, once you are sure they are clear of your car and the curb, you may pull forward and exit. (Unlike the elementary school, where adults greet students at the car and assist them in exiting, we do expect middle school students to make the car exits unassisted and to then go directly to the building. Since the office has windows that face the drop-off area, you may feel confident that your child will continue on into the building.) This allows the line to move in more of a constant flow and keeps the cars from backing up on to 77th.
4. If you are picking your child up at the end of the school day, do not block the buses at the north end of the building. Once the buses are loaded they need to be able to pull forward and exit the lot. It will be safer for all of us if car traffic stops until the buses are all on the far drive on the East side of the parking lot. If the drive in front of the building is full, please pull into the lot.
5. If your child rides a bicycle, please remind them that we ask those students who ride bikes to exit prior to the buses beginning to move or wait until all buses are on the far side of the parking lot.

Common courtesy and attentiveness to the abundance of staff, students, and parents that are crossing the drive will go a long way to keeping our drop-off area and front drive a bit safer.
